BGC MINUTES

START OF UNAPPROVED MINUTES for the 5/12/14 Meeting:

Meeting convened at 7:00 PM at the BGC Clubhouse. Board Members Present: Wayne Aycock, Tom Baldwin, Dick Brame, Jim Caison, Ray Campbell, Dave Ernst, Jeff Fountain, Tami Hahn, Tom Mix. 5 members were present.

The Minutes from the March 10 meeting were approved.

New Business:

Guest Policy

The Board discussed the guest policy and problems that have arisen. The current Bylaws state:

ARTICLE III. GUESTS

A member is entitled to bring guests to the club or club functions, limited to two guests per visit, not to exceed three visits per guest per year. The exception will be for guests who reside outside of a 100 mile radius of the club or anyone who has an active membership application on file for the current year.

Apparently some have interpreted this to mean a guest could attend 3 times with one member, then 3 times with another member. That was not the intent of this rule, a guest can come to the Club 3 times annually. They are of course welcome to any of the shoots open to the public.

In addition there was confusion about the 100 mile radius exception, so the Board voted unanimously to eliminate this section. The new section of the Bylaws will read:

ARTICLE III. GUESTS

A member is entitled to bring guests to the club or club functions, limited to two guests per visit, not to exceed three visits per guest per year. No guest may come more than 3 times each year. The exception will be for anyone who has an active membership application on file for the current year.

This rule does not apply to members of your immediate family. They are welcome anytime.

Initiation Fees

A Board member asked that the Board consider allowing the Initiation Fee for new members to be paid in installments. After some discussion, the Board decided to consider the issue at a later date should it become a problem.

Youth Guests

The Board has always tried to foster youth shooting, and the Club has had several requests for someone to bring a group of kids out to shoot. Due to liability issues, we cannot allow that to occur, but the Board did decide to allow someone to bring a guest who has one or two minor children (17 or under) with him or her.

Youth Guest Policy

In order to help foster youth shooting, each member may bring 2 adult guests per visit, as well as up to 4 additional minors (17 or under, no more than 2 minors per guest), for a total of 6 individuals. A Parental Consent Form (available on the website at

http://buccaneergunclub.org/misc/BGCMinorAuthorizationForm.pdf) must be filled out and signed by the parent or legal guardian of each child, this form must be with the supervising adult during the visit.

As a reminder, BGC host member must remain with guests at all times and **all guests** as well as each parent or adult with the children must be present and **sign a hold harmless agreement for themselves as well as each minor child**. BGC member is to have **all** guests sign in upon arrival (parents shall list minors under their names) and wear name tags while on BGC grounds (including minors). Per prior policy, each guest is still limited to 3 total visits per year.

The same general policy applies to members, a member can bring 2 youth shooters per visit, if they are not your kids you must have a signed parental consent form for each child and sign them in as your guests

Again, members of your immediate family are welcome anytime and they only have to sign in as guests normally do. There is no limitation on the number of your own children you may bring to the Club.

Headline: Spitting Contest Leads to Gunfire

You know how it goes....when cowboys get together they will always be comparing to see who has the longest......gunbarrel.......or who can shoot the straightest, or who can throw a knife the best, or something. Well at the Hard Times saloon last month the subject came up on who could spit the straightest. This reporter thinks the subject was brought to the forefront when Doc Clock spit a plug of tobacco at the spittoon and happened to get more tobacco on Blacksmith's boots than he got in the spittoon....... The short tempered Black Smith went for his 45 but before he could draw Sheriff Holliday grabbed his gun hand (That Sheriff really has fast reflexes).......The Sheriff calmed the situation by reminding the pair that they both were grown men (there may be some argument on that subject) and surely there was a better way to settle the situation.

Well after some discussion a spitting contest was devised. Since tobacco spitting is now included in the Cowboy Olympics over in Tombstone, the Olympic standard distance of 3.375 meters was decided upon as the correct distance to use for the contest. Doc and Black Smith squared off as the first contestants. Black Smith went first and must have sneezed or something during his windup and his plug went off course and landed square in the middle of Doc Clocks new Stetson hat......Well grownups or not, that was the final straw and Doc started blasting with his pistols, rifle and shotgun.
